5.0 Planning

5.1 Old Playground – erection of 1 detached dwelling house – status ongoing.

Bayford Hall Farm – change of use of agricultural land to archery range, 42 parking spaces, wooden clad storage shed, toilets and solar panels – status ongoing

The Stables - Proposed change of use of land for the creation of 7 gypsy/traveller pitches (net 5 no static caravans) parking, amenity spaces and a communal dayroom – permission granted.

14 Ashendene Road – installation of rear UPVC conservatory – status ongoing.

Bayford Hall Farm - Removal of wooden garden shed and erection of car port – permission refused.

Tudor Manor Stables – change of use and conversion of stables to provide one new dwelling, single storey infill extension and 2 dormer windows – permission granted.

6.0 Clerks Notices

- 6.1 Essex and Herts Air ambulance a letter of thanks for our donation of £100 has MB been received. A guided tour of the air base was also offered to the councillors they decided that it would be better used by a class from Bayford school. There are tree roots blocking this area and at present the water level is too GR high to investigate further. JH commented that the inflow area is also very overgrown. BO and GR will trim the hedges around the pond and AF will supply a digger to clear round the inlet.
