



ear All When the angel Gabriel visited the Virgin Mary with the divine message, Mary was probably a teenager. Despite her age, I am amazed at her response. Her position and vocation within the Kingdom of God was revealed that day. The angel revealed to Mary her vocation. She was to bring forth the begotten Son who would save the nation, bringing salvation to people by saving them from sin, darkness and death. John 1:3b-5 "...What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it.". Iesus was to be an instrument of mercy and forgiveness. Mary had to take up the representation role in the nation of Israel for God's plan to succeed. "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be *with me according to your word.*" Luke 1:38.

Does it mean that God's redemption plan would not have succeeded if Mary had not consented? No, God is omnipotent. He would have used other means of human redemption but He wants us to be part of His Kingdom plan and be actively involved.

Mary had faith, was devoted to God and full of trust. Sometime ago, I attended an Advent Course and someone from the group made a remarkable statement "I would like to think that during those days, it was frightening for a girl who was engaged to someone in the community to explain the mystery of the angel's visitation, incarnation and let alone the Holy Spirit. Mary must have been a courageous girl". Everyone in that group agreed. We came to the conclusion that God can use anyone who is willing. During the encounter when Mary accepted the Holy Spirit, all her fears disappeared. God equips those whom He calls. We also agreed that, to encourage Mary during the time of wonder, the angel Gabriel signposted her to a prayer partner-Elizabeth (who was to be the mother of John the Baptist, a forerunner of Jesus Christ).

If we yield to His purposes with trust, He will give us the people to walk beside us, the strength we need in good and challenging times. She did not need to go around trying to explain her situation or convincing people e.g there was Joseph whom she was engaged to, her relatives, the community and the Church. At the right time God revealed himself.

I would also want to view the encounter with the angel as 'A moment of visitation' which Mary by grace did not dismiss. We are all looking forward to Christmas. The past years have been very tricky because of the lockdown. Those were moments of uncertainty. Some of us had not been around our loved ones for the past Christmas seasons because of lockdown. May this Christmas season be a time of joy and visitation. Mary could have missed it but she did not. God works with the heart. If we desire, just desire to see Iesus Christ revealed to us in a special way before end of 2022. I am convinced, if we are willing to open our hearts. God will do it.

Mary's life was never the same after

the visitation, after the Holy Spirit overshowed her, she embraced grace through faith. As we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ this Christmas, may the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit be with you all. Merry Christmas! **Revd Theresa Musiwacho**

Bayford Parish Council would like to wish all Parishioners a Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

Telephone Box and Rose Triangle.

I must apologise for not pursuing these two items which were discussed at previous meetings. We have decided to employ a contractor to refurbish the telephone box. It is the classic design of Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, and thus worth preserving. Suggestions for its future use are welcome. One problem is, however, that it is likely to be damp inside. The door of the Telephone box is made of wood, which is rotten in places. Also the door has swelled and does not close. The plan at the moment is to repair the door and repaint the box.

The Rose Triangle is more complex. It seems clear now that we must involve Herts Highways in any work. Work cannot be carried out on the highway without the appropriate permit being obtained. We do not know at this time how HCC will look upon our plans.

Mineral Plan.

The latest **mineral/waste plan** for East Herts has been published. It makes no reference to Bayford. Some restoration work appears to have been carried out on the former gravel/waste site near Water Hall.

Gardening

2022 as a year will be remembered by us all in so many ways both nationally and locally and particularly in our gardens. We have had to adjust to extraordinarv weather patterns throughout and it looks as if this is going to be the future for us all. We must get used to the constantly changing weather patterns and use them as best we can and make changes where we need to. The future of Gardening means tackling things like plastics, pesticides and peat along with droughts, heat and flooding but it was ever thus. We can't manage without plastic pots but we must recycle and re-use them, we must also try to find ways to cut back on our use of peat which cannot be replaced and back cut right on the often unnecessary use of pesticides when good management can easily replace them. Present circumstances mean that we all need to use our gardens, whatever size they are, to provide as much as we can towards our daily needs and to enjoy ourselves as we do this.

There is such joy in a real Christmas tree whether it is large or small and many people have rooted ones that they carefully bring in each year and how do we keep it going from one year to the next? If you buy one that no longer has its roots be sure to give whatever is left a real soak before you put it in place and it will last much longer.

December can also be a real time for pruning and a good opportunity to start on your Wisteria, leaving three buds on shoots that sprout from the main framework, cut back your gooseberries and redcurrants removing old stems and cut your Autumn fruiting raspberries to ground level. Do also make sure that your pruning tools are sharp and you don't damage the rest of your plants. Really tidy up your climbing roses removing any weak or damaged stems and make sure that you carefully tie in the strong stems. If you are garlic lovers now is the time to plant it ready for next July but make sure you keep it weed-free. You will probably receive house plants during the festivities, try and make them last as long as possible by regular watering and draught free positions. Most of all, don't forget to feed the birds! Essendon Nature Notes

As we approach Christmas the garden is mostly silent now but our robins continue to sing throughout these months. often colder bv dav. sometimes by night. The robin's song won't reach its full glory until the new year but the sublime cadence of its wistful voice suits our mood this midwinter. It is, of course, the one bird that we associate with the festive period. The connection comes not just from its sweet December notes but from Victorian postmen who were nicknamed 'robins' because of their vermillion uniforms. As the tradition of sending Christmas cards became popular, robins were a perfect symbol of the season and they have kept their place on our mantelpieces ever since.

We all have a soft spot for the redbreasts. They have a particular affinity with us, appearing tame and friendly as they accompany our digging in the garden. opportunistically taking whatever we turn up with our spades. However this happy-go-lucky characterisation is an illusion. The robin is fiercely territorial and can be an extremely aggressive bird. David Lack's brilliant and seminal work 'The Life of the Robin' charted their battles for breeding areas in South Devon in the nineteen thirties and documented the surprising extent of their full-blooded rivalry.

They also have a reputation for nesting in unusual places. We had one in the eaves last year and another in the climbing rose but Lack records anecdotes of them using a pulpit, a human skull and even a dead cat. So when you have finished your digging for the winter, leave your old jacket in the garage or the potting shed and see if they make a home in one of the pockets come the spring. If they do, the fledged brood will need to fight for territories and vou can look forward to even more of their elegiac evensong this time next year. DC


